You're waiting to have your operation. It's important to have your general health assessed before your surgery. Here is some information on how to prepare for your appointment.

Why do I need to go to the clinic?

You'll be going to the Pre-Admission Clinic to have a health assessment before your operation.

You will have various medical tests while you're there. Your surgeon will decide which tests you need. You may be having an X-ray, an ECG (to check your heart) or blood tests.

This appointment is also designed to plan your stay in the hospital and the process of going home after your operation.

How long will it take?

Plan on spending at least half a day at the clinic.



When will I be going to the clinic?

Someone will call to tell you the **date, time and the place to come.** You will get the call anywhere from a few days to a few weeks before your scheduled surgery date.

Open from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday.

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What should I do to get ready for the clinic?

- 1 Have breakfast before going to the clinic
- **2** Take your usual medication.
- 3 When you come in for your appointment, bring an up-to-date list of all the overthe-counter drugs you're taking, including vitamins and natural health products. Ask your pharmacist to prepare the list.
- **4** Bring money for parking and a snack or lunch.



- 5 Ask a friend or relative to come with you if you need help getting around. This person can also help you remember the information you'll be given about your operation.
- 6 Bring along a book or something else to keep you busy while you're waiting.

The results of the tests performed at the clinic are usually valid for 6 months.

Who should I tell if I can't come to my appointment?

You will be given a new appointment.

What will happen after my visit to the Pre-admission Clinic?

Further tests may be needed. If so, you will be told on time.

If your assessment is complete, you will get a call telling you the date, time and place where you should go for your surgery.
