

Retinal angiogram

To evaluate the health of your eyes

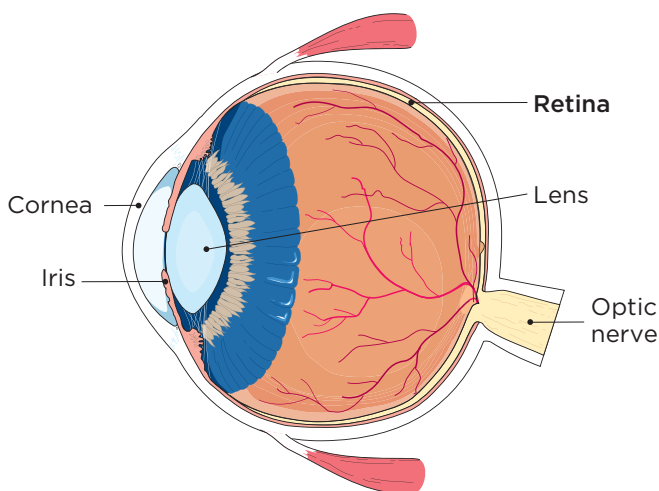


Your doctor has asked you to have a retinal angiogram. This fact sheet describes the purpose of this exam, what it consists of and the steps to follow.

What is a retinal angiogram?

A retinal angiogram is an exam used to assess the condition of the retinal vessels. The retina is a membrane that covers a large part of the back of the eye. During this exam, images are taken of the backs of your eyes.

How long does the exam take?

The exam takes about 20 minutes. Afterwards, you will be asked to stay at the clinic until the doctor sees you to make sure you don't have any side effects.

What are the steps of this exam?

- Drops are applied to dilate your pupils.
- Photos are taken of the backs of your eyes.
- A fluorescent dye (fluorescein) is injected into your veins.
- Then a second series of photos is taken of the backs of your eyes.

What discomforts are associated with this exam?

A retinal angiogram doesn't hurt. However, you may experience nausea (feeling sick) or dizziness. After the exam, you will feel discomfort in your eyes. This can last a few hours. These reactions are quite normal.

- Dilatation of your pupils will make your vision blurry for a few hours.
- The dye going through your blood will give a yellowish colour to your skin and conjunctiva (the whites of your eyes). This discoloration will appear a few minutes after the injection. It will disappear within hours after the exam.

- The dye will also pass through your urine, which will turn greenish-yellow (fluorescent) for 24 hours. This effect decreases as the dye leaves your system. If you have kidney failure, the dye may take several days to clear.
- During the exam, another dye, indocyanin green, could also be used. In this case, your stool will have a green colour.

Are there any precautions to take AFTER the exam?

- > **Have someone come with you** for the exam. You won't be able to drive your car home. If you're alone, you can take public transport.



- > **Drink plenty of water** after the exam. This will help your body eliminate the dye. If fluid intake is restricted in your case, talk to your doctor.
- > **Avoid drinking alcohol** for 24 hours after the retinal angiogram.
- > **If you're breastfeeding**, stop for two days following the exam.
